



Impact of Pupil Premium Report for 2014-2015

Year 1 Phonics

93% of PP achieved the expected standard in phonics, this is significantly above the National average (66%).

Year 2 phonics

By the end of year 2, 96% of PP children achieved the National standard, this is higher than the National average of 84%.

KS1

Whole cohort:

Reading APS- 17.0 compared to 16.6 National average

Writing APS- 14.3 compared to 15.3 National average

Maths APS- 16.5 compared to 16.4 National average

There were 25 children receiving PP funding in year 2 (2014-2015), 4 of these were SEN

Reading APS- 28.3 compared to 29.0 National average, 96% achieving expected progress (NA-91%)

Writing APS- 27.5 compared to 28.2 National average, 96% achieving expected progress (NA-94%)

Maths APS- 28.6 compared to 29.0 National average, 89% achieving expected progress (NA-90%)

GPS APS- 29.6 compared to 29.1 National average

Combined APS- 28.2 compared to 28.8 National average

There were 21 receiving PP funding in Year 6 (2014-2015), 5 of these were SEN

- Expected progress for the PP children was good and in all subjects, in maths and reading, they exceeded their non PP peers.
- Fewer PP children made more than expected progress from KS1
- In both reading and maths the PP children exceeded the national average for achieving Level 4, and with writing was only slightly below
- In maths the % of PP children to achieve a Level 5 was in line with the national average
- In reading and writing the % of PP children achieving Level 5 was below the national average
